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## KAN UPDATES

The 21<sup>st</sup> Annual Community Faculty/ KAN Conference was held March 13<sup>th</sup>-14<sup>th</sup> in Lexington. The following KAN presentations were given:

Karen Roper, PhD and Gretchen Holmes, PhD presented the results of the Patient-Engagement, Literacy, and Adherence (P-ELA) study. The seven full scale Engagement, Literacy, and Adherence instruments contained a combined total of 66 questions. Itemized Response Theory yielded a total of 7 questions from the original 66 questions which are believed to assess the same information as the larger full scale instruments. Dr. Hagen presented an explanation of the [ABFM research study](#) on Retinal Findings in Hypertensive and Diabetes, which is still being conducted. ABFM certified physicians are eligible to participate in this study, and receive \$500 for participating. The next scheduled study session is May 5<sup>th</sup>, 5:30pm- 7:30pm in Lexington at the NEW UK Family and Community Medicine location (2195 Harrodsburg Road, Suite 125) Conference Room B. 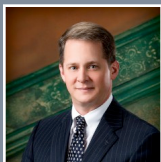
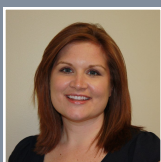
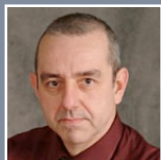

## KAN Registry Project

The purpose of the **KAN Registry Project** (KRP) is to develop and maintain a database of individuals who may be contacted for future Kentucky Ambulatory Network (KAN) associated studies. A registry can help to take the burden of recruitment for research studies off of clinics, and allows individuals who are interested in participating in research studies to self-enlist in a recruitment database. A registry makes it possible to recruit a large number of individuals for a research study in a much shorter amount of time than other recruitment methods.

This project is voluntary for KAN Clinics. KAN Clinics who agree to

participate in this project will be provided all necessary materials, including: recruitment flyers, registry cards, a lockable suggestion box which interested individuals can place completed registry cards in, and Manila envelopes to place and mail batches of registry cards to the KAN office.

Once this project is approved by the IRB, KAN clinics will be contacted to assess interest in the registry project. This will be an ongoing project, and the lockable suggestion boxes will be purchased and distributed to KAN clinics as funds allow. You may or may not be reimbursed for your time and effort for any particular study. The risk for filling out this card is breach of information. However, we take every possible precaution to minimize this risk by using secure envelopes. The information you provide us will **NOT** be shared with your doctor, employer, or insurance company. Participating or not participating in this registry will **NOT** affect the care you receive at your clinic. Please give this card directly to a front desk personnel, place it in the secure drop box, or you can mail it to us using the contact information below. ## **Central Appalachia Interdisciplinary Pain Education Collaborative (CAIPEC): Update**

We are well underway on the educational aspect of CAIPEC! The content for 7 chronic pain management modules (Epidemiology of Chronic Pain, The Biopsychosocial Aspects of Chronic Pain, Risk Management, Chronic Pain History and Shared Decision making Approaches, Examination and Diagnostic Testing in Patients with Chronic Pain, Non-Pharmacologic and Pharmacologic Treatment Options, and Practice Enhancement in Managing People with Chronic pain

through a Team based Approach) has been created. These modules have been presented at the Kentucky Academy of Family Physicians REMS and Chronic Care Management Meeting, and the West Virginia Academy of Family Physicians 63<sup>rd</sup> Annual Scientific Assembly. The next presentation will be held at the Kentucky Primary Care Association conference on May 8<sup>th</sup> at the Marriott Griffin Gate, Lexington KY. 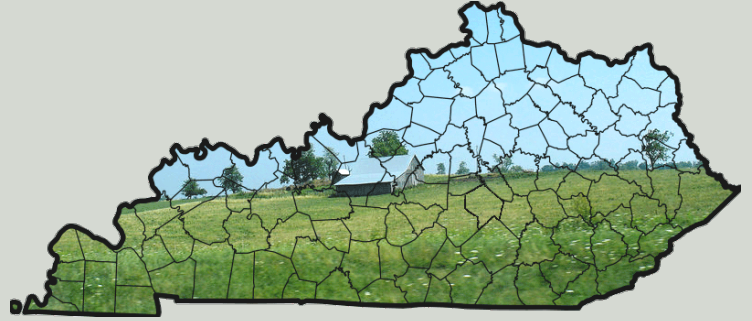
