Research Opportunities

1. The Healthier Futures Lab, directed by Dr.
Mikhail Koffarnus, Associate Professor and Vice
Chair of Research in the Department of Family and
Community Medicine is conducting an NIH-funded
experimental treatment research study
(ClinicalTrials.gov Identifier: NCT03883126)
aimed at facilitating abstinence from alcohol.
This study aims to provide incentives (depending
on group assignment) contingent upon verifiable
alcohol abstinence as measured via a small,
portable breathalyzer three times per day.

Potential participants are required to attend between one to two in-person sessions. Then, over the course of 15 months, participants complete 10 follow-up questionnaires (each questionnaire takes about 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 hours to complete) that can be completed at home and are compensated \$30 per completed questionnaire.

Depending on randomized group assignment, participants will be asked to submit breathalyzer samples three times per day and also self-report withdrawal symptoms and drinks consumed each day. The remote breathalyzer is small (fits in the palm of the hand) and breathalyzer submissions take less than 1 minute to complete. Participants will be provided a cell phone if they do not have a compatible cell phone or would not like to use their own cell phone.

Compensation for completing all study activities is dependent on the randomized group assignment and may range from \$375 to \$1,412 over the 15 months.

2. MENTORS NEEDED!

Karen Roper, PhD, of the Kentucky Ambulatory Network, has a funded study that aims to increase primary care involvement in the treatment of opioid use disorder.

As part of this effort, we are seeking primary care professionals who have experience in, and could serve as mentors to any of their Kentucky colleagues who express an interest in buprenorphine prescribing for their patients!

Anyone with this expertise will receive a per-mentee honorarium payment of \$150 to participate in one-on-one video meetings with other interested Physicians, Advanced Practice Registered Nurses, or Physician Assistants employed in primary care family or internal medicine in Kentucky.

Dr. Jon Walz DO, FAAFP is a physician who works in Eastern KY and provides primary care services to patients who have addiction issues. He has 30+ years of primary care experience in clinics and hospitals.

Dr. Walz is particularly interested in finding ways to help patients in Appalachia with Medicaid as their health insurance receive dental care. The problem is that in Appalachia there are dentists, but not dentists who are able to accept Medicaid insurance due to the low reimbursement rate.

Many dentists graduate from dental school in too much debt to consider staying in Appalachian areas and serving Medicaid patients. Dr. Walz has found one dental clinic in Huntington, WV, who is associated with Marshall University and willing to accept Kentucky Medicaid; however, getting transportation to this clinic from Appalachian Kentucky has been difficult.

In addition, dental schools do not have outreach clinics throughout the state where dental students can be trained. Dentists are typically trained at the dental school nowadays. There is a new school of dentistry emerging as part of the Pikeville School of Osteopathic Medicine. Dr. Walz is hoping that it will train and locate dentists in Appalachia which will allow for growth as it has done with primary care physicians.

This is a policy related issue. Dr. Walz would like assistance in obtaining funds to allow for dental students to be involved in outreach clinics and ultimately stay in Appalachian areas to provide services to Medicaid patients and get them the dental care needed.

Dr. Roberto Cardarelli DO, MHA, MPH, FAAFP transitioned earlier this year from being chair of the Department of Family and Community Medicine (DFCM) in the College of Medicine as well as ambulatory Chief Medical Officer (CMO) for Population Health to being the CMO at CHI Saint Joseph Hospital and CHI Saint Joseph East.

While in the DFCM, Dr. Cardarelli split his time among research, education, and patient care, and the department rose to Top 20 status in research rankings during his leadership. He became Director of KAN while being in the DFCM, focusing on quality improvement initiatives and building opportunities for CEU's and engagement among peers with similar interests. Dr. Cardarelli has always been interested in Practice-Based Research Network's (PBRN's) as he was the founder of the North Texas PBRN (NorTex). He has agreed to continue his board membership to KAN as he has transitioned to CMO at CHI Saint Joseph Healthcare.

As the CMO at CHI Saint Joseph, he is tasked with managing the budget, recruitment and training of physicians, ensuring safety standards are followed and providing optimal quality of care. We have no doubt that Dr. Cardarelli is an asset to CHI Saint Joseph Healthcare.


KAN is
