American Heart Association: Use of statins does not pose undue risk of neurological complications

Statins, drugs often used in the treatment of patients with or at higher risk of atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease, do not put people at an increased risk of neurological complications, the American Heart Association (AHA) said in a recently issued scientific statement.

A committee I have the privilege of chairing recently wrote the AHA statement, which is connected to a core function of statins: reducing low-density lipoprotein cholesterol (LDL-C).
