


## **Sports Medicine Track**



- Residents receive a parking allowance (added to payroll)
- 3 lab coats per year (choice of scrubs or lab coats)

- Approximately \$50 stipend meal money added to each paycheck.




# **Resident Wellness**

- Three YMCA facilities in the city are also available












#### **About Lexington** *The Heart of the Bluegrass*




