## Blood Borne Pathogen Exposure/Prevention



Every precaution should be taken to prevent a blood borne pathogen exposure, including

- Take care when handling needles scalpels, and other sharp instruments.
  - Don't recap used needles by hand.
  - Don't remove used needles from disposable syringes by hand.
  - Don't bend, break, or otherwise manipulate used needles by hand.
  - Placed used disposable syringes and needles, scalpel blades, etc. in puncture-resistant containers for disposal.
  - Don't hand off sharps to others for disposal.
- Wear PPE (personal protective equipment) to prevent exposure to blood and body fluids as appropriate. This
  includes goggles, face shields, masks, gowns, and gloves.
- Use Standard Precautions on every patient, every time.



## Blood Borne Pathogen Exposure/Procedure

If you have an exposure follow these steps:

- Perform basic first aid immediately.
  - Remove contact lenses and discard if eyes exposed to BBP splash. Irrigate eyes with water for 10-15 minutes.
  - Wash exposed skin with soap and water. Change exposed clothing as soon as possible.
  - If mucous membrane exposure, wash out with water for 10 minutes.
- Report the exposure and obtain source patient bloodwork. If in an outpatient setting, obtain source patient bloodwork PRIOR to allowing the source patient to leave.






## Blood Borne Pathogen Exposure/Procedure

If you have an exposure follow these steps:

- Locate a red packet from the clinic/floor manager (also located at Central Staffing in Chandler and Good Samaritan Hospital)
- Perform basic first aid immediately.
  - Remove contact lenses and discard if eyes exposed to BBP splash. Irrigate eyes with water for 10-15 minutes.
  - Wash exposed skin with soap and water. Change exposed clothing as soon as possible.
  - If mucous membrane exposure, wash out with water for 10 minutes.
- Report the exposure and obtain source patient bloodwork. If in an outpatient setting, obtain source patient bloodwork PRIOR to allowing the source patient to leave
