The Center for Health Equity Transformation (CHET, <u>https://chet.med.uky.edu/</u>) welcomes applications for a graduate research assistantship focused on innovative, transdisciplinary and impactful health equities research. CHET's



focal research involves preventing and improving outcomes from cancer, substance use, cardiovascular disease, and diabetes/obesity in vulnerable, traditionally underserved populations. Graduate students from all disciplines, including social sciences, public health, biomedical informatics, health policy, and others, are welcome. CHET research assistants will work with faculty engaged in a diverse array of research approaches, including community-based participatory research, survey design, policy, intervention, and dissemination and implementation science. CHET research assistants will engage and support efforts in research conduct, development of scholarly products (presentations, abstracts, peer-reviewed manuscripts), professional networking, enriching activities (speaker series, workshops), mentoring undergraduate students, statistical analysis, grantsmanship, and development of communication and promotional materials.

This is a full-time graduate research assistantship with a competitive stipend and tuition. The start-date is negotiable, and the assistantship may be renewable for multiple years. Members of underrepresented groups are encouraged to apply.

Dr. James Keck, Assistant Professor in the Department of Family and Community Medicine, has transitioned to a new position as a Research Physician with the Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium (ANTHC) in Anchorage, Alaska as of January 10th, 2022.

The mission of ANTHC is to "provide the highest quality health services in partnership with our people and the Alaska Tribal Health System." Dr. Keck will work with the Research Services team to better understand the substantial health disparities facing the Alaska Native people, the indigenous peoples of Alaska. Dr. Keck served



previously as an Epidemic Intelligence Service officer with the CDC's Arctic Investigations Program office in Anchorage. "I look forward to continuing the kind of communityengaged, team-based, multidisciplinary health research that CHET and UK helped me appreciate during the past five years," said Dr. Keck.



Dr. Rafael E. Pérez-Figueroa will be joining the Rutgers School of Public Health as the Associate Dean of Community Engagement and Public Health Practice in February of 2022. He will be appointed as an Associate Professor in the Department of Urban-Global Public Health and Medicine.

"I am honored to join the Rutgers School of Public Health community at this critical time. As Associate Dean of Community Engagement and Public Health Practice, I look forward to contribute fostering cooperation between the school and relevant communities and populations. By

The National Equity Atlas research partnership, a collaboration between PolicyLink and the USC Equity Research Institute, is seeking applicants for its 2022-2023 class of National Equity Atlas Fellows.

The fellowship provides an exciting opportunity for advocates working to dismantle structural racism and advance equitable policy change to deepen their data knowledge and skills. Fellows will have the opportunity to learn from other community-based leaders from across the country, share their experiences, and potentially collaborate on original data projects.

Fellows' home organizations will receive a \$7,500 stipend to support their participation in the program, and fellows will have opportunities to engage with data and policy experts, collaborate with National Equity Atlas staff, and receive training to access datasets, conduct analyses, and create maps, dashboards, and other data visuals in Tableau and other visualization software.

By the end of the program, Fellows will be able to design, develop, and produce their own custom data visualizations — such as fact sheets or interactive dashboards — to support their policy advocacy campaigns, with dedicated support and technical assistance from Atlas team members.

Graduate Training Opportunity

The University of Kentucky Human Development Institute is leading a five year Leadership Education in Neurodevelopmental Disabilities (LEND) grant from the Health Resources and Services Administration Maternal and Child Health Bureau in partnership with the University of Louisville and Eastern Kentucky University. LEND programs share the overall mission of improving the health of infants, children and adolescents with autism and other neurodevelopmental disabilities. A major focus of LEND is to increase the number of professionals with the knowledge and skills to provide evidence-based screening and diagnosis, as well as supports to individuals and families.

We are accepting applications across disciplines for the 2022 – 20223 academic year. A total of nine trainees will be accepted in the LEND traineeship, which includes leadership coursework and a rich array of clinical and community placements each semester. Trainees commit to 15 hours of LEND activities each week.

- 2. Applications will be reviewed and interviews scheduled with finalists

- an individual with an intellectual or developmental disability
