welcomes applications for a graduate research assistantship focused on innovative, transdisciplinary and impactful health equities research. CHET's



focal research involves preventing and improving outcomes from cancer, substance use, cardiovascular disease, and diabetes/obesity in vulnerable, traditionally underserved populations. Graduate students from all disciplines, including social sciences, public health, biomedical informatics, health policy, and others, are welcome. CHET research assistants will work with faculty engaged in a diverse array of research approaches, including community-based participatory research, survey design, policy, intervention, and dissemination and implementation science. CHET research assistants will engage and support efforts in research conduct, development of scholarly products (presentations, abstracts, peer-reviewed manuscripts), professional networking, enriching activities (speaker series, workshops), mentoring undergraduate students, statistical analysis, grantsmanship, and development of communication and promotional materials.

This is a full-time graduate research assistantship with a competitive stipend and tuition. The start-date is negotiable, and the assistantship may be renewable for multiple years. Members of underrepresented groups are encouraged to apply.

This special issue addresses pedagogical concepts and practices focused on antiracism and the promotion of racial justice.

Editor-in-Chief, Dr. Cheryl Merzel notes, "Our Editorial Board recognized the need to go beyond a focus on race-based health inequities, and instead, facilitate the development of a pedagogy capable of addressing structural racism and antiracist perspectives."

The issue presents 11 papers, including original research, descriptive best practices, and perspectives, that focus on student voices in the struggle against racism, addressing antiracism in the classroom, and community engagement for social justice.

Article on Unequal Distribution of NIH Research Grant Funding

A recent post in the NIH's Extramural Nexus discusses research showing inequalities among principal investigators funded by NIH Research Project Grants.

"Our analyses of PIs and organizations supported by NIH RPG awards from 1998 to 2020 show that:

- Inequalities among PIs have increased since 1998, particularly at the upper rungs and at times of NIH budget increases.
- There may be a modest decline in RPG PI inequalities over the past few years.
- Most of the funding inequalities among RPG PIs are within groups, not between groups.
- Inequalities among organizations are much greater than among PIs. Both betweengroup and within-group inequalities contribute to overall inequality."
