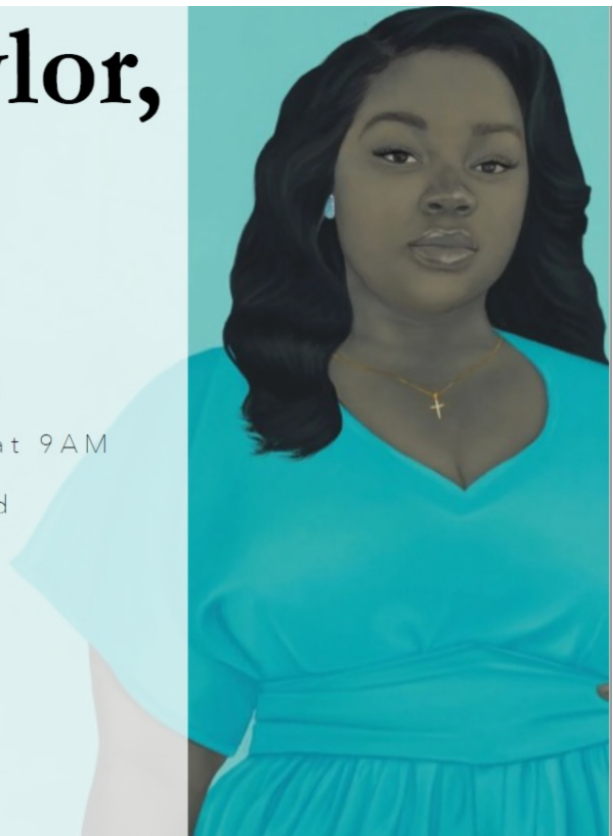

Call for Papers/Participants: Antiracist Activism in Health and Medicine

Deadline: October 15, 2021

The Sigerist Circle's scholarly session will be held on April 21, 2022 in advance of the American Association for the History of Medicine (AAHM) meeting in Saratoga Springs, New York and will include a remote option for both presenters and the audience.

In 2020, the COVID pandemic ravaged communities of color, and a nationwide uprising against racism took place. In our discussion following the last Sigerist session, participants felt strongly that next year's meeting should address these urgent issues. Rather than just diagnosing the problems, we will focus on how people fight and have fought for change.

The 2022 Sigerist Circle Scholarly Session will examine activism against racist medical and health care practices and systems, and in support of health equity. We seek both historical studies and contemporary analyses of activist individuals and groups who have targeted, and demanded solutions for, racial "disparities" in health care, in any time period and any region of the globe.

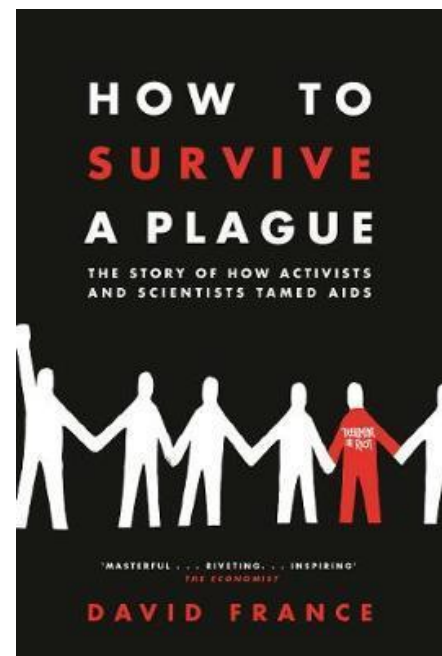

The purpose of this RFA is to solicit information and ideas for consideration to develop, cultivate, and/or strengthen community-based partnerships to reach populations disproportionately affected by COVID. This funding is to be used to ensure greater equity and access to COVID-19 vaccines and other health disparities impacting minority, marginalized and our most vulnerable populations.

Kentucky Law Journal Symposium - *The Racial Wealth Gap*

October 22, 2021

This year's Symposium will focus on the legal and historical factors that have contributed to the current state of wealth disparity in the United States that falls largely along racial lines. This disparity has been increasingly the focus of academic and policy research, and this Symposium aims to bring together practitioners, policy researchers, and scholars to explore this issue. In particular, the KLJ symposium seeks to address how tax law, property law, and other legal systems that have created and reinforced the conditions that lead to White families having median wealth of approximately \$188,000, while Black families have median wealth of only 15% of that amount, or approximately \$24,000. In addition to exploring the evolution of the problem, the KLJ symposium will explore possible solutions or proposals that would ameliorate the disparity.

Data Coordinator Senior Position

The Data Coordinator Senior will be an integral position to research efforts within the KY JCOIN Clinical Research Center. This position is necessary for achieving the goals and objectives of this project which is focused on increasing access to evidence-based treatment for women with OUD. Primary duties for this position include data entry, data management, descriptive level data analysis, and data safety and monitoring, maintain data quality and assist with technical reports and other administrative tasks. Strong communication skills, as well as attention to detail, are necessary skills for success in this position.
