CHET Faculty Awarded New Funding

CHET faculty Drs. Carolyn Lauckner and Laurie McLouth were recently awarded an R21 grant from the National Cancer Institute (1R21CA261844-01) to pilot an intervention to reduce alcohol consumption in rural-dwelling adolescent and young adult (AYA) cancer survivors. The study, "Tracking and Reducing Alcohol Consumption for Adolescent and Young Adult Survivors of Cancer," will have two parts—first, adapting and refining the Tracking and Reducing Alcohol



Consumption (TRAC) mobile health intervention for rural posttreatment AYAs, and second, testing the feasibility and acceptability of the adapted intervention through a randomized controlled trial.



While interventions exist to address physical activity, nutrition, sleep, and mood in AYA cancer survivors, no known interventions have addressed rural AYA survivor alcohol use despite the high prevalence of risky alcohol use among this population. Leveraging the high degree of digital literacy of AYAs, the TRAC mobile health intervention will address barriers to accessing substance use counseling that are common in rural areas. At the end of this study, the feasibility data gathered will inform a definitive randomized controlled trial to test the efficacy of the intervention.

We seek a health equity research leader with a dynamic, productive research agenda that aims to eliminate inequities in cancer, cardiovascular disease, dementia and other related neurological conditions, diabetes and obesity, substance use, or other health conditions. CHET is a transdisciplinary research and training center focused on developing the most innovative and impactful research and training portfolio. This position is part of a university--wide interdisciplinary cluster hire in health equity.

The ideal candidate will have a focus on rural, racial/ethnic, and other populations experiencing health inequities; leadership and administrative experience; expertise in research mentorship, and capacity to contribute to a vibrant environment of scholars from the behavioral sciences, public health, social sciences, communication, health services research, biomedical informatics, health sciences (nursing, medicine, nutrition, etc.), and others. Special emphasis is placed on intervention, dissemination, and implementation scientists with an NIH-funded research portfolio.
