

- Maximum \$25,000

Physician Research Study Opportunity

You are invited to participate in a research study entitled "Physician Perspectives on Occupational Climate and Strategies to Create and Sustain a Diverse Physician Workforce." This study is being conducted by Thailandria Daniels, a second-year medical student at the University of Kentucky College of Medicine, under the mentorship of Dr. Laurie McLouth and Dr. Jagriti Chadha to fulfill a requirement for the White Coats for Black Lives Fellowship.

The UK College of Medicine Department of Behavioral Science's White Coats for Black Lives Fellowship serves to address the health, political, and social disparities affecting Blacks in the United States. The students must develop and complete a research project within an 18-month period. Ms. Daniel's project description is listed below.
