May is Asian/Pacific American Heritage Month – a celebration of Asians and Pacific

Islanders in the United States. A rather broad term, Asian/Pacific encompasses all of the Asian continent and the Pacific islands of Melanesia (New Guinea, New Caledonia, Vanuatu, Fiji and the Solomon Islands), Micronesia (Marianas, Guam, Wake Island, Palau, Marshall Islands, Kiribati, Nauru and the Federated States of Micronesia) and Polynesia (New Zealand, Hawaiian Islands, Rotuma, Midway Islands, Samoa, American Samoa, Tonga, Tuvalu, Cook Islands, French Polynesia and Easter Island).

Asian/Pacific American Heritage Month originated as Asian/Pacific American Heritage Week and was passed by Congress in 1978. In 1992, Congress passed a law annually designating each May as Asian/Pacific American Heritage Month. The month of May was chosen to commemorate the immigration of the first Japanese to the United States on May 7, 1843, and to mark the anniversary of the completion of the transcontinental railroad on May 10, 1869. The majority of the workers who laid the tracks were Chinese immigrants.

UK-REC Scholar Training Program RFA

Deadline: June 15, 2022

The Research Education Component (REC) of our UK-Alzheimer's Disease Research Center has two REC Scholars positions open, with funding starting August 1, 2022. Appointments are for one year, with the possibility of renewal for a second year.

This program is aimed at junior investigators (assistant professors or clinical fellows) to provide protected time/support to pursue mentored basic, translational, or clinical research in Alzheimer's disease and related dementias. Areas of special interest include studies on risk factors, prevention, preclinical AD, therapeutics, caregiving, minority populations, health disparities, cognitive processes, and neuroimaging.

The awards will provide seed funding to facilitate generation of pilot data for a future grant submission. Scholars will also follow a customized training plan to foster career development goals with mentored support.
