2022 Pride Month Message

According to <u>the Library of Congress</u>, "The first Pride march in New York City was held on June 28, 1970, on the one-year anniversary of the <u>Stonewall Uprising</u>." This event marked a turning point in the United States regarding advocacy for the rights of members of the LGBTQ community. While significant gains have been made since the Stonewall Uprising, significant challenges still exist.

Since 2020, reports of discrimination based on sexual orientation or gender identity increased by 24%. This rate was highest among Black, Indigenous, and people of color (BIPOC) LGBTQ individuals. Individuals identifying as LGBTQ also experience health disparities related to preventive cancer screenings, tobacco and alcohol use, and overweight and obesity which can be linked to institutional stigma and discrimination. Initiatives such as LGBTQ* Resources, University of Kentucky's central hub for accessing information, groups, and services related to diverse sexual orientations and gender identities, are important for affirming the diverse identities that exist in UK's community. <u>Transform Health</u>, a partnership of UK HealthCare providers who have the shared goal of meeting many of the unique medical needs of people who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, queer, questioning and/or anywhere on this spectrum, as well as those who consider themselves on the transgender spectrum, tackles LGBTQ health disparities by providing high quality affirming healthcare services and training other healthcare providers. In 2021, Lexington received the highest rating in Kentucky among cities ranked in the Human Rights Campaign Municipal Equality Index, based on inclusivity of laws, policies, and services for the LGBTQ community.


However, more work is needed to achieve health equity for members of the LGBTQ community. Pledge to Take the U.S. Trans Survey

The <u>U.S. Trans Survey (USTS)</u>, administered by the National Center for Transgender Equity, is the largest survey of trans people in the United States. The USTS documents the lives and experiences of trans people in the U.S. and U.S. territories.

- The US Trans Survey is for all trans people age 16 and up.
- The USTS is for people of all trans identities, including binary and nonbinary trans identities
- The USTS is the main source of data about trans people for the media, educators, policymakers, and the general public, covering health, employment, income, the criminal justice system, etc.

• USTS reports have been a vital resource, including the reports on the experiences of people of color and reports by state.

UK HealthCare Language Services Director, Sarah Hesler, is seeking potential collaborators to develop and implement a grant project on addressing health disparities in patients with limited English proficiency (LEP) through access and utilization of language services. The Office of Minority Health (OMH) at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services has released the following funding opportunity announcement (FOA) for which applications are now being accepted:

- Announcement Number: MP-CPI-22-005
- Opportunity Title: Promoting Equitable Access to Language Services in Health and Human Services
- Award Amount: \$300,000 to \$375,000
- Estimated Total: \$3,000,000
- Application Due Date: July 15, 2022 by 6:00 p.m. ET

The initiative will support the implementation of policies, tools, resources, training, and practices that have been researched and have demonstrated effectiveness in informing individuals of limited English proficiency (LEP) of their rights to language services across the nation. OMH expects recipients/awardees to address health disparities among racial and ethnic minority populations and to demonstrate the impact of those efforts on outcomes and the overarching goal of advancing health equity.
