Postdoctoral Fellowship in Rural Cancer Prevention, Control and Survivorship

<u>A</u>ddressing <u>R</u>ural cancer <u>I</u>nequities through <u>S</u>cientific <u>E</u>xcellence (ARISE) T32 Training Program

The ARISE T32 Training Program at the University of Kentucky is now accepting applications for its innovative and enriching postdoctoral fellowship program. Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis, with fellowships potentially beginning within two months of submission. The program will provide transdisciplinary and translational postdoctoral research training



transdisciplinary and translational postdoctoral research training in rural cancer prevention, control, and survivorship, with a particular focus on health equity. ARISE provides multifaceted training opportunities to well-qualified postdoctoral scholars in applied behavioral science, including intervention, dissemination and implementation science. The two-year program will emphasize translating knowledge of risk factors into evidence-based behavioral interventions across the cancer prevention to survivorship spectrum for medically underserved rural residents. ARISE postdoctoral trainees will select three thematic behavioral cancer tracks: environment, risk behavior, and health care delivery. An experienced mentor team will work closely with each postdoctoral fellow to oversee research career development. Appropriate coursework, workshops, and other enrichment opportunities will be tailored to the fellow's needs. An experiential community-based cancer research shadowing component is embedded within the program. ARISE will draw on additional strengths and resources available at the University of Kentucky, including the Center for Health Equity Transformation, the Center for Clinical and Translational Sciences, the Office of the Vice President for Research, the Office of Postdoctoral Affairs, the Office for Institutional Diversity, and the Office for Faculty Advancement.

Achieving Equity in Black Maternal Health

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, health equity is achieved when every person has the opportunity to attain their full health potential and no one is disadvantaged from achieving this potential because of social position or other socially determined circumstances.

Healthcare has too often blamed marginalized communities for their poor health outcomes, not recognizing its own role in creating and perpetuating systemic inequities and biases. The purpose of this series is to examine healthcare's role and actions in ensuring equitable care and outcomes for all patients. This session will focus on Black maternal health.

2022 Call for Proposals- Systems for Action: Systems and Services Research to Build a Culture of Health



Systems for Action (S4A) is a signature research program of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF) that helps to build the evidence base for a Culture of Health by rigorously testing new ways of connecting the nation's fragmented medical, social, and public health systems. New strategies and tools are needed to help medical, social, and public health systems work together to dismantle structural racism and improve health and well-being for all.

S4A studies a variety of novel approaches for aligning systems, using rigorous scientific methods to determine their impact on health and health equity. This 2022 call for proposals (CFP) will provide funding for a new cohort of research studies to produce new, actionable evidence about how to help medical, social, and public health systems collaborate to address structural barriers to health and health equity, including racism and the social conditions that impact health.
