Indigenous People's Day is next Tuesday, **October 11**. To commemorate this important Day, we are highlighting our Land Acknowledgement Statement:

"The Center for Health Equity Transformation (CHET), Lexington Kentucky, is located on the original homeland of diverse Native peoples who arrived over 10,000 years ago. The most recent among them were the Shawnee. Today, Kentucky is still home to over 25,000 Native people representing scores of tribal groups. CHET recognizes the injustices Native peoples have endured. Through this statement, we hope to begin the long process of healing."

"Translating Health Equity: Neuroplasticity, Early Life Stress Exposure, and VCID"

Host: Dr. Nancy Schoenberg

Dr. Erica Littlejohn is interested in conducting mixed methods research to uncover relationships that exist between vascular contributions to cognitive impairment and dementia (VCID) and the neurophysiological consequences of Adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) exposure. Through research collaboration, Dr. Littlejohn intends to leverage Sanders-Brown Center on Aging UK-Alzheimer's Disease Center resources to identify biomarkers for VCID secondary prevention screening through clinical studies. Through multidisciplinary research, Dr. Littlejohn also plans to investigate neurophysiological consequences and sensitive ACE exposure periods in ACEs animal models of neglect, like Maternal Separation with Early Weening (MSEW) combined with experimental VCID. Her work will examine hippocampal remodeling and downstream effects on functional outcomes including learning and memory.

Topical Focus

The Center for Health Equity Transformation (CHET) announces an opportunity <u>for graduate students in the College of Arts and Sciences</u> for pilot funding to support meritorious projects that focus on identifying, reducing and/or eliminating health disparities. All applications must address how the pilot project will (1) directly contribute to achieving health equity for a vulnerable population and (2) advance the student's research prospects in terms of publications, pursuit of extramural grant support, and/or job market competitiveness as a health equity researcher. A faculty advisor is required for oversight.

Grant Specifications

- Maximum \$10,000
- Award period is 12 months
- 2-3 proposals may be funded


