UK Celebrates Latinx Heritage Month

Across the United States and Latin America, we celebrate 500 years of Latin American identity, cultures, languages and specifically honor the vast contributions of Latin Americans to the United States.

Since 1968, Latinx/Hispanic Heritage Month is observed from Sept. 15 to Oct. 15. At the University of Kentucky, our community more commonly refers to the month as "Latinx Heritage Month" to be inclusive of not just Hispanic —



or Spanish-speaking nations — but rather the entire Latin American diaspora and all its peoples. It recognizes all countries in North, Central, South America and the

Caribbean. Furthermore, the "X" in Latinx symbolizes and reclaims Latin Americans across the gender spectrum, but also honors some of the various indigenous peoples in the Americas, preand post-colonialism. Additionally, the X serves as an indicator of gender-fluidity, something challenged due to the gendered nature of the Spanish language.

The Martin Luther King Center at UK, along with campus and community partners, will host a variety of experiences to celebrate and amplify the richness of Latinx/Hispanic heritage and culture at UK and beyond.




Water and Health Equity: Past, Present, & Future Opportunities for Action (Free Webinar)

Now in its 5th year, the SUHI Equity Research Fellows program was designed to strengthen research and collaboration among scientists and universities who share our focus. Fellows generally spend one day a week collaborating on jointly-developed manuscripts, proposals, and other equity-related projects.

Candidates must have a PhD (or equivalent terminal degree) and be on the faculty at any US college or university. The Fellowship runs from Jan 1 – Dec 30, 2023. Fellows will receive a stipend of \$15,000. Applications are due by **October 14**.

Public Comments Solicited for the Federal Evidence Agenda on LGBTQI+ Equity

The Office of Science and Technology is requesting input from the public to help inform the development of the Federal Evidence Agenda on LGBTQI+ Equity.

Executive Order 14075 on Advancing Equality for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, and Intersex Individuals required the co-chairs of the Interagency Working Group on Equitable Data to establish a subcommittee on sexual orientation, gender identity, and variations in sex characteristics (SOGI) data. That body, now part of the National Science and Technology Council (NSTC) Subcommittee on Equitable Data, is tasked with the development and release of a Federal Evidence Agenda on LGBTQI+ Equity, which will improve the Federal government's ability to make data-informed policy decisions that advance equity for the LGBTQI+ community.
