OBLIGATIONS:

Fellows will have already completed the required CITI training in the projection of human subjects required by the UK College of Medicine prior to starting any research, unless the research is deemed exempt. A total of \$1,800 will be distributed to fellows as timesheets are submitted.

If accepted, Fellows commit to:

- 1. work closely with their mentor to complete all agreements for the research that are agreed upon.
- 2. present the results of their research to the Department of Family and Community Medicine department faculty and staff at the end of the program.
- 3. submit the project for presentation (poster or oral) at the UK Center for Clinical and Translational Science's Spring research showcase or another acceptable research conference for a local or national audience.
- 4. cite the DFCM research fellowship program in presentations and/or publications that result from the work.
